State and Local Candidate Questions

1. Do you support Indiana's informed consent law that requires that women be informed, in writing, of the risks of abortion, alternatives to abortion, and fetal development (including information about fetal pain) at least 18 hours prior to an abortion?
2. Do you oppose partial birth abortion, the procedure that kills a living child during delivery?
3. Do you believe that pharmacy workers should have the right to refuse dispensing drugs that they have reason to believe will be used to cause abortions?
4. Do you oppose physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia?
5. Do you oppose all efforts to clone human embryos?
6. Do you oppose fetal stem cell research that requires the destruction of human embryos?
7. Do you oppose using taxpayer funds to pay for elective abortions, to subsidize abortion providers, or to subsidize abortion referring agencies, such as Planned Parenthood?
8. Do you support current Indiana law stating that human physical life begins when a human ovum is fertilized by a human sperm?
9. Do you support your political party's national platform on abortion? (see platforms at www.nci4life.org)
10. Do you believe that abortion providers should be required to provide to the State, in writing, proof that they have local hospital admitting privileges or have entered into a written agreement with another physician with local hospital admitting privileges.
11. Do you believe all abortion facilities should be required to comply with all federal, state and local building regulations regarding health, safety, and ambulance access?
12. Do you oppose legislation that would eliminate current state laws that regulate abortion?
13. Do you believe that abortion providers should be required to dispose of aborted children in a humane manner, instead of treating remains as mere "medical waste"?
14. Will you vote only for party and caucus leadership that is committed to protecting innocent life from conception to natural death?
15. Do you support laws that promote adoption?
16. Under what circumstances do you believe abortion should be legal? (Choose all that apply.)

1. Would you vote to repeal the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act", commonly known as Obamacare?
2. Do you support a ban on all efforts to clone human embryos?
3. Do you oppose using federal funding for embryonic stem cell research that requires the destruction of human embryos?
4. Would you oppose any efforts to repeal or weaken the Unborn Victims of Violence Act?
5. Do you advocate changing Roe v. Wade, Doe v. Bolton, and Casey v. Planned Parenthood decisions so that elected legislative bodies (state legislatures and Congress) may once again protect unborn children by limiting and/or prohibiting abortion?
6. Would you oppose any legislation that would weaken the Hyde Amendment and other current laws that restrict federal subsidies for abortion?
7. Would you vote to prevent further U.S. funding of the United Nations Population Fund?
8. Would you vote for the Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act?
9. Would you vote for the No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act?
10. Would you vote for legislation that would make abortion clinics, and organizations that operate abortion clinics, ineligible for Title X funding?
11. Would you vote for the Pain-Capable Child Protection Act?
12. Would you support Federal law to strengthen policy against assisted suicide, including overturning the D.C. law?
