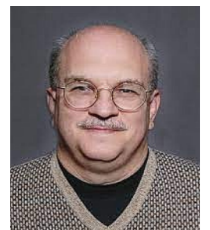


Keynote Speaker: Scott Klusendorf - President of Life Training Institute and Author of The Case for Life

A passionate and engaging speaker, Scott has appeared on nationally syndicated Christian programs such as Dr. James Dobson's *Focus on the Family*, and Lee Strobel's *Faith Under Fire*. Scott is a graduate of UCLA and holds a Master's degree in Christian Apologetics from Biola University. He and his wife Stephanie have been married since 1985 and they have 4 children.

Roger Grossman has been broadcasting at WRSW since 1991, but he is certainly more than just a radio announcer. He also has been serving as the play-by-play voice of the NCCAA Women's Division I national championship tournament held at Grace College.
