Daniel Elliott - Indiana State Treasurer

Treasurer Elliott was elected as the 56th Indiana State Treasurer on November 8th, 2022. In this role, he serves as the Chair of the Indiana Bond Bank, the Statewide E-911 Board, the Indiana Education Savings Authority, the ABLE Authority, and the Sole Trustee of the State Police Pension Trust, among several

other positions. As the state's chief investment officer, he oversees the management of over \$13 billion on a daily basis.

Prior to becoming Treasurer, Daniel Elliott worked his entire 25-year professional career in information technology, first as a software engineer and then as a software architect.

Daniel grew up in the unincorporated town of Nebraska, in rural Jennings County and graduated from Utah Valley University. Today, he lives on a small farm in rural Morgan County with his wife, Laura, and their four children. He is a proud school-choice dad and an advocate for traditional Hoosier values.

Daniel loves to spend time with his family and outdoors. One of his passions is training his own horses, and he and his children can often be found outside riding their horses on a beautiful Indiana afternoon.
