Sheila Harper - Founder and President of SaveOne

Sheila Harper is the Founder and President of SaveOne, a global outreach ministry helping men, women, and families recover after abortion. She holds a Master's degree in biblical counseling, is a certified mental health coach with the American Association of Christian Counselors, and is the author of 10

books. Her first book, *SaveOne-A Guide to Emotional Healing after Abortion*, has been translated and distributed in 23 languages.

SaveOne currently has over 400 chapters in 27 countries. Sheila has traveled the world speaking on the topic of abortion recovery as well as training abortion recovery leaders.

She has been featured in many magazines and articles about her work in the abortion recovery field and has appeared on *The 700 Club*, *Ministry NOW with Joni and Marcus Lamb*, *Table Talk with Joni and friends* on *Daystar TV*, and most recently had the great honor of being named one of "Huck's Heroes" on *The Mike Huckabee Show*.

Sheila and her husband Jack planted Crossroads Church and pastored there for 11 years before working together at SaveOne. After enduring seven years of personal anguish over choosing abortion, she found restoration and forgiveness through Jesus Christ.

Sheila has two awesome sons and an amazing daughter-in-law. Jack and Sheila live in Nashville, TN.

Mike Cline is a native of Marion, a graduate of Marion High School, Ball State University, and Nashville School of Law in Nashville, Tenn.

He worked at the *Chronicle-Tribune* for 28 years as a sports writer, reporter, and editor. Other professional stops along the way to retirement include about five years as an editor at Vanderbilt Medical Center in Nashville; two years as media director for the Indiana House of Representatives Republican caucus in Indianapolis; and nine years with the Grant County Prosecutor's Office.

Other endeavors include serving 17 years on the Marion Public Library board of trustees; about five years as a CASA; nine years as a member of the Community Foundation board of directors; several years as a member of the Grant County Family YMCA board of directors; coaching, when his three children were younger, youth sports – baseball, basketball, and soccer – at Marion's PAL Club, YMCA, and Upward; and he is a current member of the Grant County Public Defender Board and the Marion City Council. He and his wife, Jane, deliver Meals on Wheels and attend St. James Lutheran Church.
